It is my pleasure to offer my strong support for Vaishali Jain’s application to your organization. For background, I am an Assistant Professor of Digital Media at Georgia Tech who works on ethical technology design using perspectives from human-computer interaction (HCI), design, and science & technology studies (STS). I know Vaishali by being her Masters Final Project advisor in the Digital Media program, and through her enrollment in my Project Studio course in Fall 2023 which focused on the creation of provocative design artifacts to explore potential social and ethical issues related to technology design and use, utilizing techniques such as speculative design and design fiction.

Vaishali’s Masters Final Project explores how to design ethically for a world with sensors that detect, analyze, and respond to people’s emotions (or an “Internet of Emotional Things”). This began as project in my Project Studio course, where Vaishali designed multiple interface mockups of what it might be like for users to experience and interact with an Internet of Emotional Things in many contexts of their lives, including text messaging apps, smart appliances like refrigerators, or in cars and vehicles. As part of her Masters Project, Vaishali is using these designs as conversation starters with users, conducting in-depth interviews with people to understand the potential ethical concerns they may have with these types of technologies (such as concerns about privacy). Vaishali’s project recognizes the need to consider the perspectives of multiple stakeholders who may have different views on what is beneficial or harmful in these systems. From these interviews, Vaishali plans to synthesize a set of ethical design guidelines for the design of emotion sensing technologies.

The products designed by Vaishali for this project serve as “conversation starters” about the types of emotion-sensitive technologies that are likely to be developed and deployed in the near future. I find Vaishali’s work highly important, as it helps us have conversations with users and key stakeholders about ethical harms *before* they happen, so that we can design in a way that proactively addresses potential harms. This approach can be used in the design of other products as well. This project showcases Vaishali’s skills related to UI/UX design, design and user

research, product design, and more broadly thinking about the social and ethical aspects of design work.

It is my great pleasure to recommend Vaishali. As Vaishali's instructor for two classes, Principles of Interaction Design and The Computer as an Expressive Medium, as well as a member of Vaishali's MS thesis project committee, I have observed and evaluated Vaishali's performance as a designer and technologist through numerous class sessions and design critiques. Vaishali consistently does excellent work, going above and beyond expectations, always on time. Vaishali consistently produces excellent work, with sleek, professional designs.

Vaishali's MS thesis project investigates ethical protocols for emotion-sensitive technologies. This responds to a rapidly growing space of Emotion AI, which uses data about people's bodies and behaviors to predict people's emotions. These technologies show great promise but also raise ethical concerns around privacy and well-being. Vaishali's MS project topic fulfills an urgent need to support ethical, responsible Emotion AI innovation. Vaishali has outlined an exceptionally rigorous human-centered project timeline including literature review, landscape analysis, user interviews, stakeholder interviews, design and technical development, and user evaluation and iterative improvement. The outputs of this project will be useful to any company developing or interested in Emotion AI, as well as offering a unique research contribution.

In Principles of Interaction Design, students design and prototype screen-based interfaces and conduct user evaluations. Students complete many design assignments that increase in complexity, and with design critiques and user evaluations they iteratively improve their designs. Vaishali's final project again combined creativity, criticality, and technical prowess. The project explored Emotion AI, an emerging suite of technologies that use data about people's bodies and behaviors to predictively categorize emotions. The final project envisioned an interactive game in which people are given a memory of their own, and challenged to make their game partner feel the same way they did during that memory. The project thoughtfully navigated ethical concerns of Emotion AI and philosophical issues of the limits of empathy and memory. While navigating this challenging territory, the project took the form of a game and invited a playful interaction, with a design that evoked a feeling of gentle playfulness—a challenging balance to pull off conceptually and formally.

In The Computer as an Expressive Medium, students program creative human-computer interactions in p5js. For The Computer as an Expressive Medium, Vaishali's project explored the politics of body ownership, a challenging biopolitical topic. The p5js interactive sketch used skeleton tracking to make a cyborg figure follow the user. The sketch also used a voice interface so that users could talk with the cyborg figure. Users could vocally inquire about different body parts to learn about biometric surveillance and political agendas controlling bodies. This was presented in a compelling aesthetic, poetic format that created a powerful emotional effect.

The final projects for each class demonstrated Vaishali's exceptional skills in interaction design, user interface design, teamwork, mockups, web development, industry-standard UI software





such as Figma, and visual artistic skills. In addition to demonstrating strong skills in research, interaction design, graphic design, and interactive programming, Vaishali brings a level of maturity, professionalism, and an ethos of teamwork and community support that will be an asset to any team.

About me: I am a tenure-track assistant professor in Digital Media at Georgia Tech. My design research investigates tangible, emotional, social ways of engaging physiological data. I publish at top-tier venues in Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) such as CHI (Human Factors in Computing Systems) and DIS (Designing Interactive Systems). I did my PhD at UC Berkeley in the School of Information as a member of the BioSENSE lab. Prior to grad school, I worked as a full stack web developer for Intel Labs and The Echo Nest, a music data startup that was later bought by Spotify.
